

## 301 Website & Web Page Re-directs

This is commonly used when a page is deleted, but still shown up on search engines, so the best solution is to re-redirect it rather than an error message presented to the visitor.

If you have to change file names or move pages around, it's the safest option. The code "301" is interpreted as "moved permanently".

Below are methods to create a webpage/website Redirection

### PHP Redirect

```
<?
Header( "HTTP/1.1 301 Moved Permanently" );
Header( "Location: http://www.visualwebz.com" );
?>
```

### ASP Redirect

```
<%@ Language=VBScript %>
<%
Response.Status="301 Moved Permanently"
Response.AddHeader "Location","http://www.visualwebz.com"
%>
```

### ASP .NET Redirect

```
<script runat="server">
private void Page_Load(object sender, System.EventArgs e)
{
Response.Status = "301 Moved Permanently";
Response.AddHeader("Location","http://www.visualwebz.com");
}
</script>
```

### JSP (Java) Redirect

```
<%
response.setStatus(301);
response.setHeader( "Location", "http://www.visualwebz.com" );
response.setHeader( "Connection", "close" );
```
